

HYLAND HOUSE

Hyland House is a 24/7 facility that operates on King George Blvd. It contains one primary shelter and one emergency shelter for extreme weather conditions.

It also offers a transitional housing program.

Beds

- -35 beds in main building
- -15 beds for extreme weather
- -20 room bachelor apartment
 - -Designed as individual apartments

Income Assistance

-Helping with financial needs/problems

Counselor

-Including for addictions

Outreach worker

- -Employment search
- -Life skills

Housing workers

- Helping those who need to find housing
- -Home managment
- -Community integration

Hyland House provides two types of supported housing. Transitional housing and supported housing.

Transistional Housing

-Individuals stay in a self contained bachelor suite. Individuals are required to pay rent. The rent is determined on income. Individuals in transitional housing usually stay until they can successfully keep up their independence.

Supported Housing

-For individuals who have stayed at
Hyland House, this program attempts to
help individuals with housing
support. Also helps individuals who have
rent supplements available to them through
the mobile outreach program.

Rules apply to all types of housing (all rules to be discussed upon arival)

- Must be older than 19
- -Have to be clean/sober for 24 hours
- In order to be accepted into Hyland

 House, individuals cannot have criminal charges against women or children.
- Not medically trained
 - -(Meaning they will not provide medicinal help to shelter residents.

 But, will store medicine at shelter.)
- 2 bags for room (personal belongings)
- Store items in cubicles relating to residents room numbers
- Curfew 10pm unless work or doctor note is provided, the shelter does need confirmation
- 11 o clock is final call and all residents should be in bed.
- Anyone is welcome to the shelter however no pets!
